APPLICATION OF THE EQUIVALENT CARBON PRICE FOR SYNTHETIC GREENHOUSE GASES: IMPLICATIONS FOR IMPORTERS

Katie Volter, Department of Sustainability, Environment, Water, Population and Communities

Under the Australian Government's plan for a Clean Energy Future, an equivalent carbon price has been applied to synthetic greenhouse gases. These gases include hydrofluorocarbons (HFCs), perfluorocarbons (PFCs) and sulfur hexafluoride (SF6) that are imported either as bulk gases or in equipment such as refrigerators, freezers, air conditioners, some fire protection equipment, electrical switchgear and some aerosols.

This session will provide a summary of the government program that applies the equivalent carbon price to synthetic greenhouse gases, including an update on:

- 1. The practical implementation of the carbon price to the imports of bulk gases or gases in equipment.
- The legal aspects of applying the carbon price to synthetic greenhouse gases what are the changes industry will see.
- 3. ACCC aspects of misleading conduct ensuring that any changes to costs that are attributed to the carbon cost are justified, and
- 4. Export rebate arrangements.




